As a young teen, the genus *Rhododendron* always captivated Bob and he spent many hours selling azaleas to home gardeners. Bob later embarked upon a journey to create new

hybrid varieties of *Rhododendrons*. In his presentation he will talk about why he began his breeding program as well as discuss the challenges of growing and maintaining healthy *Rhododendrons* in the Piedmont and mountains of the Carolinas.

Bob is a second-generation nurseryman earning his B.S. degree in Ornamental Horticulture from Clemson University. He worked for 14 years as an Area Ornamental Horticultural Specialist for Clemson University Cooperative Extension Service. In 1998, Bob returned full time to his family business. Head-Lee Nursery, Inc. in Seneca, South Carolina, a 50 year old family owned retail-wholesale nursery.



They will soon release the Debut Series® of re-blooming evergreen Azaleas.

There were 39 people who enjoyed the fascinating talk and gorgeous pictures as Cathy took us for a 3 mile hike along a trail leading across the Round, Jane and Grassy Ridge Balds in the Roan Mountain area of the Appalachians. She showed us amazing plants, offering a wide variety of textures, that can be used in our own landscapes with rhododendrons and azaleas, providing a natural look.



Both door prizes, brought by Rich Becker, were won by visitors. Scrumptious refreshments brought by Jean Pace, Glenn O'Sheal, Claudine Miller and Rose Johnson were enjoyed by all, as members and guests shared their love of plants with one another. The visitors all were encouraged to join our Association before the March Banquet.

A short business meeting resulted in two motions. One was to approve the proposed agreement on the disbursement



of 2012 Convention funds between SE-ARS and the Vaseyi Chapter, ASA. The other was to approve a motion to <u>not</u> sell plants at the 2010 Hendersonville Garden Jubilee on Memorial Day weekend. This may be a viable option for next year. It was announced that the Vaseyi Chapter ASA will hold a garden tour open to the public in cooperation with

ECO on Saturday, May 8. SE-ARS garden tours will be arranged, and there will be hikes to see the native azaleas in mid June.



John Brown made a short presentation on the Hooper Bald Project sponsored by the Mid-Atlantic Chapter, ARS. They are looking for people to join them on April 9, 10, and 11 at the Micro-tel in Robbinsville, to clear away overgrowth which is causing the balds to disappear. He said that Gregory Bald used to be about 20 acres, and due to reforestation receded to only about 13 acres. It is their goal, in cooperation with the US Forest Service, to restore it back to 20 acres. Contact John for more information about the project or to volunteer early in April.

In Memorium

John Paulding Mixner, 94, retired Research Professor Emeritus of Animal Physiology, Rutgers University, and a resident of Carolina Village, in



Hendersonville, died January 19. He served on the Rutgers faculty for 30 years and was Chairman of the Department of Animal Sciences for the second 15. His principal areas of research dealt with dairy cattle for which he published numerous journal articles and received several prestigious awards.

He retired in 1977 and moved to Hendersonville where he and his wife developed an outstanding rhododendron and azalea garden. They were awarded the Bronze Medal of the Southeastern Chapter of the American Rhododendron Society in 1993 in recognition of their contributions to the Society. He enjoyed photography in his travels to over 50 countries around the world.

Glenn's Blackberry Wine Cake

½ cup pecans (broken) 1 pkg. white cake mix 1 pkg. blackberry jello ½ cup vegetable oil 4 eggs ½ cup blackberry wine

Glaze:

½ cup margarine or butter, melted and cooled ½ cup blackberry wine 2 cups confectioners sugar

Preheat oven to 350°. Grease and flour tube pan. Sprinkle nuts evenly on the bottom of the pan. Blend cake mix, jello, oil, wine, and eggs on low speed for one minute. Increase speed to medium high and beat for 5 minutes. Pour batter into pan. Bake for 45-50 minutes, or until top is brown. While cake is baking prepare glaze. Combine cooled margarine or butter and wine. Stir in sugar until smooth. Make holes in top of cake with a fork. Pour glaze on **hot** cake.

This was served at the February SE-ARS meeting and several asked for the recipe. So here it is!
