Cutting Exchange was a Great Success!

Doley Bell opened the meeting in the absence of the President. 29 people were there, including 6 guests who were welcomed. They were Theresa and John Emma of Pisgah Forest, Bing and Judy Crawford of Laurel Park, Ron Ferrell of Easley, and Byron Richards of Hendersonville. Plants brought by Leon Pace and Mo Watson were given to each of the guests and members who wanted them.



Sieglinde Anderson, Vice President and Program Chair, led a rousing discussion on cuttings. She was very well prepared and everyone participated enthusiastically. The opinions on when to take the cuttings were surprisingly varied, from July to November. Bottom line, it depends on which method you use to root them. If it snaps it's too late. A rooting hormone is needed with rhododendrons and deciduous azaleas, but not needed for evergreen azaleas. The cuttings can be refrigerated from 24 hours to 10 days, then the key is to keep the humidity high. The medium used ranged from sand, peat moss, 3-B soil mix, pearlite and/or mixtures of same. Glenn O'Sheal demonstrated how to scrape the sides of the stems and cut off parts of the leaves. If there's a bloom bud, take it off, but leave a terminal bud on. Stick it into the hormone, then in damp medium in trays. He suggested if you root in a clear plastic cup you can see the roots developing. Aaron Cook offered to bring some "Dip and Grow" to share to the next meeting October 16. The cuttings need to be protected from freezing solid and from direct sunlight. If they freeze, wind will burn them. They should be put into bigger pots in pine bark loose mix, up to 1 gal for the first year. Wayne Hutchins

uses Osmocote 14-14-14 once in the summer for amazing growth. They can be pinched back for fuller growth.

Following the discussion, cuttings were shared. Those who brought cuttings had first pick, but there were enough for everyone who wanted them.


