Join Brian Upchurch for a whirlwind tour of Japan, Korea, and China looking for new plants for our gardens back home. Subtitled "Adventures and Misadventures in Japan, Korea, and China," Brian

will cover the often humorous and strange adventures in seeking plants in foreign countries – meeting fellow

plantsmen, collecting in the wild, exploring arboreta and specialty nurseries in the region; as well as the trials and tribulations of paperwork and government agencies. Plants featured in his presentation will include deciduous and coniferous species adapted to southern and mid-Atlantic gardens.

Brian is the owner of Highland Creek Nursery in Fletcher, NC, a wholesale nursery specializing in the



propagation of unusual, rare and not yet introduced woody ornamentals. His nursery offers grafted liners and bare-root plants to the trade

throughout the Eastern USA, Japan and parts of Europe. Many of his introductions are also available at retail to gardeners from PendulousPlants.com and SmallPlants.com, Internet based mail order companies. They also exhibit at the NC Growers Show at the Farmers Market in Asheville each year

for on the spot buying.

Brian has received many awards and publishes frequently in the American Nurseryman and other trade journals. He also gives frequent lectures

and holds seminars at local, regional and international meetings on grafting, marketing, research and production practices.

## Lepidote Rhododendrons a Popular Topic at February Meeting

Our first meeting for 2013 had 32 people attending, including 7 guests, to hear Ray Head speak on Lepidote Rhododendrons with Jackson McCarter's

Power Point photos illustrating, at St. John in the Wilderness Parish Hall in Flat Rock, NC. Three of



the guests joined at this event.

Ray's presentation was outstanding! He had a printed handout; Jackson illustrated with beautiful pictures; and Ray had a very informative display board of cuttings in bud from many lepidote rhododendrons. Lepidote rhododendrons are wonderful plants in our southeastern gardens, but are not widely available in the nursery trade.

The meeting began with a vote on the Bylaw changes that have been published in the last two newsletters. There were 25 members present, (30 made a quorum), so the President directed the Secretary to send an e-mail to the membership requesting a vote from those who were not present. A motion was made by Jackson McCarter and seconded, to adopt the Bylaw changes as published. The vote passed unanimously. Note: An e-mail which was sent by the Secretary on Monday, Feb. 18 to the membership, received 16 affirmative votes, more than exceeding the required quorum.

Jackson announced that David Grantham, an Associate member of SE-ARS, is coordinating a project to study the Haag Hybrids for the 2016 ARS spring Convention being hosted by District 9 in the Mid Atlantic area. He would like our chapter to be involved in gathering information.

The March 23rd banquet was announced. Glenn O'Sheal announced slight adjustments to the flower show times to conform with the NC Arboretum's

new hours. Jackson has some plants left over from the convention which may be offered for sale at a plant sale at the Arboretum flower show weekend, May 4-5.

We also discussed participating in the Hendersonville Garden Jubilee Festival, May 25 and 26, Memorial Day weekend. A Brand new member, Wayne Orchard, will loan us a 10' x10' canopy, and several people offered to help get plants and to staff the booth. Marilyn & Don Haynes will chair it. It's a wonderful opportunity to advance our mission. If you too can help, please let Marilyn Haynes know.

David Dethero brought a ball and burlap "mystery plant" that was covered with buds, to be given to the first of the guests to join. Susan Boland and

Wayne Orchard joined, and Joan Hardy, ARS member from the Princeton, NJ, Chapter, ARS, joined as an Associate member. Wayne and Susan



live in Flat Rock, and Joan is in the process of relocating to western NC.

Vice President, Sieglinde Anderson, announced that Vaseyi is holding a program on mosses on March 24. She is working on garden visits and hikes for April and May. She urged us to think about appointing a hospitality chair.

Audrey Stelloh, Nominating Chair, announced that we need a President, Secretary and Treasurer for next year. The Secretary does not need to do the newsletter unless he/she wants to; Marilyn will consider continuing with that if requested by the new Secretary.
